SUBJECT: US Army Garrison (USAG) Daegu Policy Letter #18 Standards of Conduct and Ethics

1. This policy is effective immediately. It remains in effect until rescinded or superseded.
2. REFERENCES.
  - a. Army Regulation 600-20, Army Command Policy, 18 April 2008
  - b. Joint Ethics Regulation Department of Defense (DOD) 5500.7-R
3. PURPOSE. Department of the Army personnel must place loyalty to country, ethical principles and law above private gain and other personal interests. The performance of duties should be in keeping with the highest tradition of Military and Civilian service to the USAG Daegu, The Department of the Army (DA), The Department of Defense (DOD), The United States Government and America's Public.
4. APPLICABILITY. All personnel servicing in the USAG Daegu Area of Responsibility (AOR) must meet the minimum standards of conduct required of all Soldiers, and Army Civilians as prescribed in the listed references. They provide Army personnel with guidance on a multitude of ethical issues, including the avoidance of conflicts of interest between their commercial or financial interests and their official duties,
5. POLICY. All Army personnel listed will receive face to face annual ethics training as prescribed by DOD 500.7-R: personnel required to file either a public or confidential financial disclosure report, contracting officers, procurement officials and others, as identified by an Army Ethics counselor
